Why do we need more dog friendly areas?

In the spring of 2012, Council received a request from the public to consider a dog park in Peachland. In follow up to the request, staff did some preliminary research, then Council directed staff to form a Dog Park Advisory committee. The committee reviewed policies and practices in other communities, visited dog parks, and conducted a survey of Peachland dog owners. In the fall of 2013, the committee proposed a multi-year strategy to develop dog parks in Peachland.

The Committee noted the following rationale for change in Peachland:

- The Current Park Bylaw is very restrictive to dogs in parks;
- District of Peachland does not have an off-leash dog area;
- Dog owners travel to neighbouring municipalities to use dog parks;
- Stay and play in neighbourhoods (reduce vehicular travel); and
- Decentralized access to reduce congestion in dog friendly parks.



Highlights of New Bylaw

- No dogs allowed on parks with playgrounds, sports fields and designated swim beaches;
- Allow dogs on leash in all other parks and greens spaces;
- Designate a park in each hillside community for dogs allowed off leash (Sanderson Park, Pincushion Place Park, and MacKinnon Park);
- Designate T-dock/Doggie Beach as an off leash area;
- Designate the beach at Strachans Corner as dogs allowed on leash (previously a pilot project);
- Designate a beach area north of Todd's
 Campground as dogs allowed on leash
 (between 3896 Beach Avenue to the residential home at 3860 Beach Avenue; and
- Responsible dog ownership and related fines for not picking up dog poop (in conjunction with the Regional District Responsible Dog Ownership Bylaw).
