



## **JUDICIAL RECOUNT INFORMATION**

An application for a judicial recount of ballots for the election of Mayor for the District of Peachland was made yesterday, by Chief Elections Officer Polly Palmer, for the District of Peachland. The hearing of the application is set for tomorrow, October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2018, at 11:30 am, at the Provincial Courthouse in Kelowna. All mayoral candidates, their official agents and legal counsel of the candidates are entitled to be present at the hearing. The hearing will be open to the public as well.

At the hearing, the date and time for the judicial recount will be set.

The Chief Election Officer, the candidates affected in the election and the official agents and legal counsel of the candidates are entitled to be present at the judicial recount. Other persons may be present only if permitted by the Court. The judicial recount must be completed by the end of the 13<sup>th</sup> day after the close of general voting, which is November 2, 2018.

At the completion of the judicial recount, if the result cannot be declared because there is an equality of votes, the results will be determined by lot. The Court will oversee and direct this process at the conclusion of the judicial recount. The Court will direct a person who is not a candidate or candidate representative, to make the draw, and will then declare elected the candidate whose name is on the paper that was drawn.
