

# Demo of this site on 5th to start soon



In response to an application made by the Peachland Seniors Support Society (PSSS), the District of Peachland has granted the society a temporary licence of occupation and demolition permits to remove all structures at four adjacent properties, 4426, 4440, 4444, and 4450 5th Street.

In the meantime, PSSS and BC Housing are working toward fulfilling commitments they previously made

through rezoning conditions and legal agreements related to Phase 2 of a seniors' affordable housing project at the site. The Society's professional contractor will safely secure all four buildings and the surrounding area during the demolition process.

In the District of Peachland, short-term rental (anything under 30 days) of a private room or a suite in a home is regulated under the Zoning Bylaw as Bed and Breakfasts (B&B). There are two types of B&Bs:

- Traditional B&B with an individual room and a shared living facility, and
- 2. Suite B&B

Short-term rental of an entire dwelling, including a garden suite or recreational vehicle, is not allowed in Peachland. The operator of the bed and breakfast must have a business license and the rental must be operated at the licensee's principal residence. Find out more, and a helpful guide to B&B's at

# • LEVEL 1. • Water Restrictions

DID YOU KNOW, that Peachland is always on Stage 1 water restrictions? They remain in effect regardless of the abundance of water as restrictions reduce consumption which decreases the demand on the reservoirs and water treatment costs. If conditions change, there are 4 stages of water restrictions that may be enacted. The status of the District's water storage is evaluated frequently and changes may occur at any time. #### STAGE 1 RESTRICTIONS - ALTERNATE DAYS

Even numbered addresses water on even calendar days Odd numbered addresses water on odd calendar days On permitted days, automatic sprinklers - midnight to 6:00 am and manually controlled sprinklers - 6 am to 11 am & 6 pm to midnight. No watering permitted between 11 am and 6 pm.



# Making Sense of Parcel Taxes

We've been letting residents of Peachland know that Council plans to make significant

changes to Peachland's Parcel Taxes for the 2024 Budget. We've introduced new ones, closed others and rolled some into general taxes. Parcel taxes will decrease in 2024 from 2023 by approximately \$114.

Parcel taxes are flat rates on properties in a particular service area. The tax is levied per parcel, no matter the size of the property. Parcel taxes are set for a finite period, usually for a specific project or service. Property taxes, on the other hand, are levied based on the assessed value of a property. Your taxes vary depending on the value of your property.

For years, Peachland has been collecting parcel taxes for asset renewal or capital expenditures for sewer or water infrastructure. Prudent long-term planning dictates that our infrastructure accommodates current and future users, with all taxpayers contributing towards maintenance and replacement because, we all know, nothing lasts forever.

To that end, our General Capital Asset Renewal, Sewer Capital Asset Renewal, Water Capital Asset Renewal and Water Capital Improvement parcel taxes will be transferred to general taxes for 2024. This will ensure balanced planning and funding for the ongoing needs of our assets. Under Council's direction, the District is continually seeking funding support through grants from the provincial and federal governments. Any grant money we receive will be used to reduce the cost to taxpayers.

Council is committed to fiscal responsibility; it's one of the five pillars of our Strategic Priorities. Watch for an update on our Strategic Priorities in an upcoming newsletter. As always, Council welcomes your thoughts on how we're doing. Email **council@peachland.ca**.

# Council Highlights

Peachland Water Supply Analysis
Council discussed the Draft

Peachland Water Supply Analysis, an update to the last major water master plan update in 2015. It now considers new information including updated meter data, development build-out numbers and new climate data. The analysis was conducted by Urban Systems and indicates that Peachland's water supply, primarly sourced from Peachland Creek, is adequate until 2070. The report includes recommendations for upgrades to water infrastucture to address potential challenges and encourages efforts to reduce demand.

#### **Developments Approved**

**Princeton Neighbourhood** 

Council adopted a Zoning Bylaw Amendment to rezone a .4 hectare vacant lot in the Lower Princeton Area to allow the building of up to 23 residential units in a 14-unit strata community with townhouse building forms and flex units.

Trepanier Bench & Huston Road Council authorized a development permit for a residential multi-family development at 5325 Trepanier Bench Road and 5334 Huston Road. The permit allows for the construction of a 62-unit residential multi-family development consisting of 28 walk-up units and 34 walk-out units in 11 buildings.

#### **Growing Communities Fund**

Council established the Growing Communities Fund Reserve to allow for the appropriate treatment of a \$2.76 million grant the District received in March 2023. Council has earmarked expenditures from the fund in the 2024 Budget including road improvements, upgrades to Turner and Sanderson Parks and expansion fo the Westside Trail.

Council agreed to provide the Peachland Chamber of Commerce with a one-time, start-up donation of \$7,000 to ensure the 25th annual Peachland Classic Car Show is a success. The event is planned for the May long weekend.
