

Paving the Way for Child Care Centre

Offsite works to pave the way for Peachland's new Child Care Centre began on Clements Crescent on March 10. The work is expected to be complete in two months with construction activities taking place between 7 am and 7 pm, Monday to Saturday. 🔍 Water Restrictions 🔍

DID YOU KNOW ... ?

Peachland is always on Stage 1 water restrictions. They remain in effect regardless of the abundance of water. Restrictions reduce consumption which decreases demand on reservoirs and water treatment costs. As conditions change, there are four stages of water restrictions that may be enacted.

STAGE 1 Even # address	STAGE 2 Even # address	STAGE 3	STAGE 4
water on even calendar days, Odd on odd calendar days Watering not permitted between 11 am and 6 pm	water Saturday and Tuesday, odd on Sunday and Wednesday Watering not permitted between 11 am and 6 pm	Even # address water Saturday, odd on Sunday Watering not permitted between 10 am and 7pm	No outdoor watering permitted



As temperatures rise and bears come out of hibernation, they're hungry and looking for food sources, even if it means going for unnatural ones like household garbage. It is important to take steps to ensure bears and other wildlife are not drawn to your property due to attractants such as garbage, bird feeders and pet food.

- Put garbage out on collection day only: NEVER the night before.
- Encourage neighbors to do the same: Offer help if needed.
- Secure garbage: Store it indoors or in a bear resistant enclosure.
- Clean recyclables: Wash them before placing in cart.
- Freeze kitchen waste: Until collection day.
- Maintain compost: Avoid smells, no meat/dairy.
- · Avoid bird feeders: Use birdbaths and houses instead.
- Clean BBQ grills: Burn off grills, clean grease traps, store equipment securely.
- Feed pets indoors: Store pet food inside.
- Secure food indoors: Avoid using outdoor fridges and freezers.

Grant Buys New Trees at Sanderson Dog Park

The District of Peachland is investing \$5,000 into new trees at Sanderson Dog Off-Leash Park and on Beach Avenue, thanks to a grant from BC Hydro's Community ReGreening Program. Nine trees will be planted at the new off-leash dog park at Sanderson Park, 5900 Sanderson Avenue. The trees will complement the new park which saw a \$100,000 upgrade last year with the installation of water service and formal fencing. Two trees will be planted on Beach Avenue near 13th Street to replace ones that have died. The species being planted at Sanderson are 3 Autumn Blaze Red Maples, 3 Lavelle Hawthornes and 3 Dawyck Beech. The two trees being planted on Beach Avenue will be Columnar Dawyck Beech.

Future location of Mosaic Mural at the Peachland Community Centre



Mayor's Message Celebrating Arts, Culture & Community

Peachland has always been a town that values its arts, culture, and community spirit, and Council is proud to continue that tradition! We understand that a vibrant arts and culture scene is the heart of any great

community, so we've worked hard to ensure ongoing support and funding for the organizations that make Peachland unique. One of the most exciting steps forward has been the dedication of the Historic Schoolhouse's front space as a cultural building, a permanent home for the arts and creativity to flourish.

But we didn't stop there! This Council played a key role in bringing together three incredible community groups—BEEPS, the Okanagan Folk School, and the Peachland Arts Council (ART Gallery)—under one umbrella: the Our SPACE Society. This innovative partnership ensures that Peachland's cultural hub remains strong for future generations. To demonstrate our commitment, we've provided a civic grant of \$21,000 and a lease agreement for just \$1 per year. Additionally, the District has stepped up to finance significant capital improvements, including the installation of a new heating and cooling system, which is scheduled to be completed soon.

Our investment in the arts doesn't stop at one building. Every year, the District provides nearly \$250,000 to community groups, ensuring that local programs and events thrive. This includes \$20,000 for the Historic Society to preserve Peachland's rich history and approximately \$80,000 for groups such as Peachland Wellness Centre, Peachland Community Policing, Peachland Historic Society, and the beloved Fall Fair, to name a few.

We also provide valuable in-kind support, such as utilizing community spaces for arts events and mural projects, which helps bring color and culture to our town. Our \$1 lease agreements have enabled essential organizations, such as the 50+ Centre, the Food Bank, and the Wellness Centre, to operate and serve residents without financial strain.

Beyond the arts, Council also invests in Peachland's infrastructure. Thanks to a \$2.76 million Growing Community Fund grant from BC in 2023, we've allocated funding for many thoughtful investments including Turner Park improvements (\$850,000), the purchase of land for a Child Care Centre (\$500,000), new pickleball courts (\$200,000), a new multi-use trail to connect to West Kelowna (\$360,000) and much more. The province determines eligibile uses, which don't include arts and culture, but we've ensured investment in projects that will benefit many residents and visitors for years.

Council is proud to support our community's creative and cultural heart while ensuring that Peachland remains a fantastic place to live, work and play. We look forward to seeing you at an upcoming arts event, on the trails, at Turner Park or maybe even on the pickleball courts! Let's continue to build a strong, vibrant and connected community together.

Council Highlights

Wild Goose Street

Feb. 25 - Council adopted Official Community Plan and Zoning amendment bylaws for District-owned property at 5601 Wild Goose Street, a new road to be created as part of the development. It is named after Wild Goose Bill, the first known settler on the land which later became Peachland. The road will lead to the Peachland Child Care Centre adjacent to the Peachland Elementary School. The property's new OCP designation is Institutional and is now zoned P2 Public/Institutional, allowing the development of the centre.



Wibit Waterpark

Mar. 11 - Council agreed to charge the owners of the Wibit Waterpark \$3,951/year for its seasonal lease of a portion of the community's waterfront and enter into an agreement for another five year term.

New Collective Agreement

Mar. 11 - After an in-camera meeting, Deptuty Mayor Keith Thom rose and reported that Council had agreed to authorize the signing of the new 2024 to 2027 Collective Agreement between the District of Peachland and CUPE 608, the union representing the District's 39 full-time, part-time and casual employees.

New Street: Brigade Court

Mar. 25 - Council approved the name "Brigade Court" for a new public road constructed at 4880 Princeton Avenue. The new street name for the subdivision in the Upper Princeton neighbourhood is in accordance with the District's Street Naming Policy. Working with the Peachland Historical Society, the name was chosen as the word "brigade" appears often in Peachland's history with the Fur Brigade Trail and the Peachland Fire Brigade.
