Pay in person at Municipal Hall, 5806 Beach Avenue, or drop off your non-cash payment in our drop box located to the right of the main entrance. You can make payments online through most financial institutions.

Remember to claim your **HOME OWNER GRANT** by the deadline to avoid penalties. Visit www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant or call toll free 1-888-355-2700 to claim. Avoid a late charge of 10% - payment and Home Owner Grants must be received on or before July 2, 2025.

Museum's Best Side is Showing Visitor Centre opens

after renovations

Renovations at the Peachland Museum, the new location of Peachland's Visitor Centre, are complete and staff and volunteers are happily receiving visitors - 300, in fact, came to visit during the Peachland Classic Car Show.

"They come from all continents," says Barb Dionne, president of the Peachland Hstorical Society. "We always get a lot of European and American visitors but this year, we are seeing many more Canadians than usual."

The museum's operators are pleased to be the new host of the community's official Visitor's Centre, but leff Green, Assistant Curator and manager of the Centre says, "So many people just arriving to town are checking out the museum first. We're used to giving out information about Peachland."

The District invested \$850,000 on upgrades, helped by a \$600,000 Community Economic Resiliency Infrastructure grant. This included the removal of lead and asbestos from the 114-year-old historic building. Structural reinforcements on the second floor, electrical upgrades and a new HVAC system were completed. Spruced up concrete and landscaping is a welcome addition.

See the new displays of historical artifacts and don't miss that marvelous miniature railroad diorama that circumnavigates the second floor! The Museum & Tourism Centre is open 10 am to 4 pm, closed Mondays. They will be open extended hours, 7 days a week starting July 1.

The District successfully applied to the Province of BC's Disaster Resilience and Climate Change Risk Assessment. Peachland has experienced significant emergency activations in the past 10 years due to widespread flooding, extreme heat and drought conditions. This analysis will identify and map specific hazards and risks the community faces. Underlying it all will be consideration of climate change and its impacts. The assessment

Multi-Use Trail Open



Park on Beach Avenue to access the 2.8 km trail via Buchanan Road and Robinson Place. The newly constructed trail sections begin at Robinson Lane and connect to Goat's Peak Park near the Seclusion Bay Road/Highway 97 underpass. It is made up of off-street multi-use pathways and a stretch of neighbourhood bikeway along Drought Road.

Bring plenty of water and sunscreen.

The new Peachland to West Kelowna Multi-Use Trail is complete! Cyclists and pedestrians now have a safe connection to Goat's Peak Park, thanks to funding from the BC Ministry of Transportation and the Federal Ministry of Intergovernmental Affairs

The trail is open to the public, with a grand opening celebration on June 20. Construction of the Trail began in October 2024, funded with \$920,236 from BC Active Transportation Infrastructure Grants and \$356,400 from the Federal Communities' Active Transportation Fund of the Permanent Public Transit Program.

The trail ties into a planned 250 km multi-purpose trail system that will span the Okanagan Valley. Three trail systems are close to connecting the communities from Sicamous in the North to Osoyoos in the south with the Shuswap North Okanagan Rail Trail, the Okanagan Rail Trail and The Trail of Okanagans. A fully connected trail system is expected to have a profound economic impact for the region and communities along the system and vault the trail system to one of international significance.

The \$100,000 cost of the park improvements, which included water service installation, was paid for in part by the Growing Communities Fund. A \$5,000 grant from BC Hydro's ReGreening program was used to plant new trees in the park.

Turner Park Update

Construction is nearing a close at Turner Park. The work in the upper tier began in October 2024 and included the installation of accessible picnic areas, a children's playground and upgraded washrooms. This phase also includes constructing accessible pathways and tables, benches and waste receptacles, complemented with vegetation and a shade structure. The parking area will be improved and the old sports box area replaced with grass. The Turner Park Upgrade is funded through a portion of a \$2.7 million Growing Communities Fund grant and a Jays Care Foundation grant. Turner Park is expected to be fully open in September 2025, and remains closed to the public to allow the sports field turf time to be established.

Annual Report

Council Highlights May 13, 2025 - Special Council Meeting

Financial Plan & Tax Rate Bylaws

Council adopted the 2025 Flnancial Plan Bylaw and the 2025 Tax Rates Bylaw which incude a 6.65% tax increase. The increase equates to a \$111 annual increase for the typical single-family home assessed at \$887,000.

May 22 - Regular Council Meeting

RCMP Update

Council received an update from Staff Sergeant Brendan Dolan and Corporal Tyrone Wilton on RCMP activities in the community. Corporal Wilton of the West Kelowna Detachment's traffic services, said he has spearheaded an initiative for extra traffic enforcement in Peachland. He indicated the move was prompted by remarks in the Citizens' Survey the District conducted in 2024.

Meeting Time Change

Council adopted an updated *Procedure Bylaw* to include a trial change to the start time of meetings until the end of the year. The trial will mean Regular Council meetings will begin at 3 pm instead of 6 pm and is expected to result in operational efficiences and costs savings. Public Hearings will still be held at

Child Care Center Construction Variance

Council authorized variances to the Zoning Bylaw for the future home of the Peachland Child Care Centre at 5601 Wild Goose Street. The variances allow a reduction in the building setback in three different locations:

- South side reduction in setback from 7.5m to 4m
- West side reduction in setback from 7.5m to 4.5m
- · Interior side reduction in setback from 7.5m to 4m

Landscaping, an outdoor play space and a shared drive aisle for access to off-street parking will minimize the impact of these variances. Parking requirements were also varied to allow fewer parking stalls and to eliminate the need for passenger loading stalls. It is anticipated that more than half of attending children will not need to be dropped off. A custom-length bus loading stall is also included in the overall parking count. The District received \$12.2 million through ChildCareBC's New Spaces Fund to build a new 104-space centre which will be operated by the Boys and Girls Club of the Okanagan.
