Please read this BEFORE lighting that brush pile!



In Peachland, permits are required before ANY open burning can be done, and these fires are only allowed on a residential property that is 1 hectare (2 1/2 acres) or more. Also, you can NEVER burn compostable materials like leaves, grass or pine needles. Permits are granted after every reasonable alternative to remove wood debris has been pursued. Only cured, dried wood can be burned and only on proper venting days when open burning is allowed. Find out more at www.peachland.ca.

Speculation Tax Notices Coming for Peachland Homeowners



Effective January 2024, Peachland property owners must complete a Speculation Tax Declaration each year. The Province announced the expansion of the tax to Peachland and other areas of BC in November 2023, with the tax taking effect for the 2024 taxable year. Peachland property owners will receive a declaration letter by the end of February, and must complete the declaration by March 31. Most Peachland homeowners will be exempt from the tax because they live in their homes, but all homeowners still need to fill out the declaration every year. Taxes are applied if you do not live in the home you own in a speculation tax area, but there are exemptions. The tax is designed to discourage housing speculation or vacant homes. wastewater infrastructure. It is an update to the District's existing phasing plan for system expansion into established neighbourhoods and was funded through a Canada Community Building Fund grant. The WWMP ensures that the District's

Taking the input from Council into account, the consultant, Urban Systems, will proceed with the communication plan focusing on support for establishment of Local Area Service (LAS) and potential grant applications; a LAS is a cost sharing process for implementing neighbourhood infrastructure works and is divided by all benefiting property owners. The next round of communications will involve targeted outreach to residents in the areas identified in the draft report as priority zones for sewer installation, ensuring they are informed about the phases of work including potential milestones and expected costs.

A final report and presentation to Council will be made at a Regular Council meeting once the public outreach and engagement phases of the workplan are completed, which is anticipated to be by June 2025.

Zoning Amendment 4607 Princeton Avenue

Council adopted Zoning Amendment Bylaw 2333 to rezone 4607 Princeton Avenue from Rural Residential to Multi-Unit Residential – Medium Density to allow construction of a residential development with up to 26 units. In September 2024, Council granted a three-month extension to the rezoning request, which has been instream since June 2020.
