Peachland's roads and sidewalks are cleared and sanded based on priority to ensure the most heavily used routes and important emergency corridors are passable during snow events. During active snowfall, crews continue to work on Priority 1 routes and Priority 2 and 3 roads may need to wait.

Peachland's crews are hard at work before, during and after the snow falls to keep our community moving.

Priority 1

Bus routes, major arterial roads, steep hills, intersections, school zones

Plowing

 Driving lanes plowed within 12 hours.

Sanding

 Intersections, stop signs, hills, curves, school zones, bus stops sanded with in 4 hours of snowfall

Priority 2

Secondary collector roads

Plowing

 Driving lanes plowed to a compacted snow surface within 36 hours.

Sanding

 Intersections, stop signs, sanded within 6 hours of Priority 1 completion.

Priority 3

Residential side streets, flat roads, cul-de-sacs

Plowing

Driving lanes plowed to a compacted snow surface within 96 hours.

Sanding

 Intersections, stop signs, sanded within 12 hours of Priority 2 completion.

PLOWING PEACHLAND

- There are 140 roads in Peachland totaling 65 kilometres. Each road can take two to four passes to completely plow.
- Operators strive to get the roads in safe drivable condition as soon as they can. Equipment breakdowns are unavoidable and can create frustrating delays in plowing and sanding.
- Snow plowing and sanding may also be delayed by vehicles disabled in deep snow, vehicles parked on the roadway, severe weather and whiteout conditions, refueling, sand refilling blade replacement and unforeseen emergencies.
- Snow Removal is undertaken when accumulation prohibits the normal seasonal movement of vehicles and pedestrians or impacts sightlines.



SIDEWALKS

- Property Owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks or footpaths bordering their property.
- Our Operations Department and Parks
 Department remove snow from sidewalks
 adjacent to civic buildings, selected parks and
 pedestrian accesses.
- The District will plow sidewalks on major arterial

routes that have no abutting residences or businesses, sidewalks fronting bus routes, schools and businesses as well as walkways to, from and through parks and public areas.
